THE ILLINOIS FEDERATION OF
SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE CLUBS
CONSITUTION

PREAMBLE: The members of this organization are banded together in a spirit of friendliness and good fellowship to share the pleasures of square and round dancing. In order that the organization may function smoothly as a group for the benefit of all, the following Constitution is herewith established.

ARTICLE I
Name

The name of this organization shall be the ILLINOIS FEDERATION OF SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE CLUBS.

ARTICLE II
Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be:

1. To promote and maintain the highest square and round dance standards.
2. To assist in the organization of square and round dance clubs.
3. To assist in the development of callers and music, and maintain information regarding same.
4. To promote an Annual State Square and Round Dance Festival
5. To see that any and all information for the benefit of the membership and the promotion of the purpose of this organization be distributed to its members.

ARTICLE III
Membership

Any square or round dance club may become a member of this organization upon meeting the qualifications as provided in Article II of the Bylaws and upon the payment of annual dues.

ARTICLE IV
Officers

Section 1. OFFICERS. The officers of this organization shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer and shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors, as provided in Article III of the Bylaws.

Section 2. QUALIFICATION: At the time of their official election to an office, the officers of this organization shall be elected from the membership of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. TERMS OF OFFICERS. Each officer shall take office immediately following their election and serve for one year or until their successor is elected and qualified.

Section 4. DUTIES. Their duties shall be such as pertain to these offices and as provided in Article IV of the Bylaws.

ARTICLE V Board of Directors

Section 1. MEMBERSHIP. The membership of the Board of Directors shall consist of two (2) delegates, elected from the membership of each member club, except that a square or round dance caller/instructor may not serve as a delegate.

Sections 2. CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. The president shall be chairman of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. TERM OF OFFICE. The term of office of all members of the Board of Directors shall begin immediately following election by their member club.

Section 4. VACANCIES. In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors, it shall be the responsibility of the club having the vacancy to elect a new delegate to fill the unexpired term.

Section 5. A delegate must be a member of the club represented.

ARTICLE VI Meetings

Section 1. The Board of Directors of the Illinois Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs shall hold three stated meetings during each calendar year and such additional called meetings as are prescribed in the Bylaws, Article VI.

Section 2. QUORUM An attendance of at least 33% of the membership shall be necessary for a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VII Constitution Amendments

This constitution may be amended at any stated meeting of the Board of Directors of the Federation at which a quorum is present, and by two-thirds majority of those present, provided the proposed amendment has been read at the meeting just previous, and that copies of the proposed amendment have been provided to all Delegates at least thirty days before such vote is to be taken and/or included in the Square Chute that is published for the respective quarter at which the vote should be taken.

THE ILLINOIS FEDERATION OF

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I
Restrictions

Section 1. This Federation at no time shall endorse or recommend any candidate for political office, nor shall politics or political candidates be discussed at the meeting. Also, no religious discussions shall be tolerated at the meeting.

Section 2. No officer or member of this Federation shall use it as a means for furthering any personal, political, or other aspirations, nor shall the Federation, as a whole, take part in any movement not in keeping with the real purpose and objects of the Federation.

ARTICLE II
Membership

Section 1. ELIGIBILITY. Any open square or round dance club organized for the purpose of square or round dancing which meets regularly, at least once each month during at least seven months of each year, shall be eligible for membership in the Illinois Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs provided:

- a) Said club has a complement of officers such as President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and that said officers are elected at a stated business meeting by popular vote of some majority of the club's membership and that:
- b) The name of said club and names of its principal officers accompany their membership application.

Section 2. MEMBERSHIP APPLICATIONS.

1. Any square or round dance club may apply for membership in the Illinois Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs by presenting or mailing its request together with its credentials, qualifications, and a year's dues to the membership committee.
2. The membership committee shall, upon approval of the application, present same to the members of the Board of Directors at the next regularly scheduled board meeting for final acceptance or rejection.

Section 3. DUES.

1. The annual dues for member clubs in this organization shall be set by the Board of Directors and shall be due and payable to the Treasurer of the Federation upon acceptance to the membership and on or before January 31st of each year thereafter.
2. Any club delinquent over sixty days shall be dropped from membership after proper notification of the Secretary. Such delinquent clubs may reinstate after six months by payment of current dues rather than being treated as a new applicant.

Section 4. EXPULSION.

1. The membership committee may, after due investigation, request the Board of Directors to drop from the Federation's membership any club whose conduct is not in accordance with the Constitution of the Federation.
2. Any club that does not have delegates present for at least one meeting of any three consecutive meetings will automatically be dropped from membership. The Secretary of the Federation will advise such clubs in writing of their jeopardy after they have missed two consecutive meetings.

ARTICLE III

Officers

Section 1. ELECTIONS. At the annual meeting of the Board of Directors, the President shall conduct an election for all elective offices to be filled at that time. The Executive Committee (see ARTICLE IV, Section 6) shall present a slate of officers and the Board of Directors shall vote on those nominees and any other nominations made from the floor.

Section 2. MAJORITY REQUIRED FOR ELECTION. Election to office shall require a majority vote of the Quorum present.

ARTICLE IV

Duties of Officers/Officer Replacement

Section 1. PRESIDENT.

1. The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of this organization and shall:
 - a. Preside at all meetings and serve as Chair of the Board of Directors,
 - b. Issue calls for regular and special meetings of the Board of Directors of the Federation,
 - c. Act as ex-officio member of all committees,
 - d. See that these committees function and that members cooperate with their respective chairs to accomplish committee objectives,
 - e. Call for regular committee reports,
 - f. Insure that regular elections are held in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws.
2. The President may not initiate a motion but may call for a motion on any item under discussion.
3. The current and past two Presidents are responsible for securing the featured caller / instructor for the Festival scheduled 3 years from election of the current President.
4. If, for any reason, the President is unable to perform the duties of office, the Vice-President shall occupy the position and perform the duties having the same authority as the President.

Section 2. SECRETARY. The Secretary shall be under the supervision and direction of the President and the Board of Directors and shall keep the

general records of the organization. These records shall include minutes of the Board of Directors meetings, committee appointments, and lists of member clubs showing their officers, caller and addresses. This list of clubs will be provided annually to the member clubs.

Section 3. TREASURER. The Treasurer shall keep a detailed record of the Federation's receipts and disbursements and shall collect from member clubs and all others, all monies due the Federation. The Treasurer shall deposit same in a bank or banks recommended by the Board of Directors and shall pay out money only on the authority of the Board of Directors. All checks and vouchers must be signed by the Treasurer who shall prepare and submit periodic financial reports to the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall give bond for the faithful discharge of the duties of office in such sum and with such sureties as may be required by the Board of Directors. The cost of securing said bond shall be paid out of funds of the Federation.

Section 4. VICE-PRESIDENT The Vice-President substitutes or succeeds for the President in case of absence or vacancy and shall, under direction of the President, oversee the functioning of such committees as the President may designate.

Section 5. OFFICER REPLACEMENT. If for any reason the office of President shall become vacant, the Vice-President shall succeed in office. In the event of a vacancy in any other office, the Executive Committee shall appoint a member of the Board of Directors to fill the unexpired term.

Section 6. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

1. The Executive Committee of the Federation shall consist of the four immediate past presidents of the Federation.
2. It shall be the function of this committee to act in an advisory capacity to the current administration and to perform any other special duties enumerated by the Bylaws for Standing Rules.
3. If any of the four immediate past presidents are unable to serve, succeeding past presidents may be added to restore the committee to four.

ARTICLE V

Powers and Duties of the Board of Directors

Section 1. The duties of the Board of Directors shall be as follows:

1. The Board of Directors shall be responsible for the execution, through its officers, of the authorized policies of the organization.
2. It shall authorize all expenditures and shall not create any indebtedness beyond the income of the organization, nor distribute funds for purposes non-essential to the objectives of the Federation.
3. A majority vote of the Board of Directors shall govern, except where otherwise provided. The Board of Directors shall have the power to overrule or modify the action of any officer of the Federation.
4. It shall elect the officers of the organization from among its members.

5. It shall have books and accounts reviewed by the Financial Committee annually, or more often at its discretion.
6. It shall hold regular meetings.
7. It shall hold special meetings, when called or as provided in these Bylaws.
8. It shall designate a bank or banks for the deposit of the funds of the organization and invest the surplus funds.
9. It shall receive committee reports and recommendations.
10. It shall have the power to accept or expel member clubs in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution and Bylaws.

ARTICLE IV Federation Meetings and Dances

Section 1. STATED MEETINGS. The stated meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held the 3rd Sunday of the months of October and January and on the 1st Saturday in the month of May.

Section 2. CALLED MEETINGS. In addition to the three stated meetings of the Federation, the President may call such other meetings of the Board as necessary with such action being at the discretion of the President.

Section 3. ANNUAL MEETING. The May meeting of the Board of Directors shall be known as the Annual meeting.

Section 4. At each stated meeting, the Board of Directors shall designate a time and place for the next stated meeting.

Section 5. MAY FESTIVAL

1. The Annual Square and Round Dance Festival, The May Festival, shall be held on the first Saturday of May each year.
2. At the January stated meeting a principle item of business will be planning for the annual Festival.

Section 6. FEDERATION DANCES. In addition to the Festival Dance, the Federation shall sponsor dances on the third Sunday of October and January following the stated meetings in those months.

Section 7. All expenses of and monies received from any activity sponsored by the Federation become part of the Federation business.

ARTICLE VII Federation Callers / Cuers

Section 1. FEDERATION CALLERS. A Federation Caller/Cuer is a Square Dance Caller or a Round Dance Cuer who teaches lessons for and/or who regularly calls or cues for a Federation club or one who has provided these services for a Federation club in the past.

Section 2. Only Federation Callers/Cuers may call at Federation dances and at the Federation's May Festival except that a featured Square Dance Caller and a featured Round Dance Cuer shall be employed for the May Festival.

Section 3. In the event that an adequate number of Federation callers or cuers are not available at Federation dances or the May Festival to fill the dance program needs, other callers and cuers who are not Federation Callers/Cuers may be added to the dance program as needed or desired.

ARTICLE VIII Square Chute

The Federation will provide the publication Square Chute quarterly in accordance with procedure summarized in the standing rules.

ARTICLE IX Bylaw Amendments

Section 1. The Bylaws may be amended at any stated or called meeting of the Board of Directors of the Federation at which a quorum is present, and by two-thirds majority of those present, provided copies of the proposed amendment have been sent to all delegates at least 30 days previous to the time such vote is to be taken and/or included in the Square Chute that is published for the respective quarter at which the vote would be taken.

Section 2. These BYLAWS or any part thereof may be suspended by a motion from the floor from stated meeting to stated meeting provided that (1) an emergency is declared by a majority of the delegates present and (2) it is for the good and welfare of the federation,

ILLINOIS FEDERATION OF

STANDING RULES

ARTICLE I
Membership Dues

The annual dues for member clubs shall be \$10.00 and shall remain so until such time as the Board of Directors may elect to modify in accordance with Article II, Section 3 of the Bylaws.

ARTICLE II
Federation Meetings

Section 1. DATES AND TIMES. The dates of the stated meetings are as defined in the Bylaws, Article VI, Section 1 at 1:00 PM for the October and January meeting and at 9:00 AM for the May Annual Meeting.

Section 2. ORDER OF BUSINESS. The following order of business shall be followed at Federation Board of Directors stated meetings:

1. Pledge of allegiance and invocation.
2. Roll call and declaration of quorum.
3. Reading of preceding minutes.
4. Treasurer's report.
5. Report of committees.
6. Old business, new business.
7. For the good of state wide square and round dancing.
8. Motion for time and place of next meeting.

Section 3. STANDING COMMITTEES. At the Annual Meeting, the incoming President shall appoint chairs for the following committees:

1. Membership Committee
2. Festival Committee
3. Finance Committee
4. Development Committee
5. Round Dance Committee

Section 4. The Chairs of the standing committees will appoint committee members as necessary.

Section 5. The American flag shall be displayed at all Federation meetings and dances.

ARTICLE III
Federation Dances

Section 1. DATES AND TIMES. The dates of the two (2) Federation dances are as defined by the Bylaws, Article VI, Section 5, 2:00 PM to 6:00 PM.

Section 2. FEES. The registration fee (donations) for each of these dances shall be set by the officers as the financial needs of the Federation dictate.

Section 3. PROGRAMMING. Federation dance programming shall provide for two (2) round dances between each square dance tip.

ARTICLE IV May Festival

Section 1. DATE AND TIME.

1. The Annual Square and Round Dance Festival, The May Festival, shall be held on the first Saturday of May each year, Bylaws Article VI, Section 5.
2. The Host Club (s) for the May Festival may at their election include activities on the preceding Friday evening.
3. Dance times are outlined in the attachment to these Standing Rules, Tab. 2, Suggested May Festival Procedures

Section 2. FEES. The fee structure (donation) for each May Festival will be recommended by the Federation Officers after consultation with the Host Club (s) and approved by the Board of Directors no later than the January meeting preceding the Festival.

Section 3. MAY FESTIVAL FEATURED CALLER / CUER

1. The featured Square Dance Caller and Round Dance Cuer are to be secured three (3) years in advance if possible.
2. The committee making this selection is composed of the current Federation President and the two (2) immediately preceding past presidents of the Federation, Bylaws Article IV, Section 1, Paragraph 3.
3. A contract specifying the hours and fee will be signed by the Caller / Cuer.
4. The featured Square Dance Caller will call a one-hour workshop Saturday afternoon and a three-hour dance Saturday evening.
5. The featured Round Dance Cuer will instruct a two-hour workshop and provide a short exhibition during the dance.
6. The Executive Committee shall approve the reasonable fee necessary to secure the featured Caller / Cuer.

Section 4. PROCEDURE. A suggested procedure for host club (s) use is provided as an attachment to these Standing Rules, Tab. 2. suggested May Festival Procedures.

ARTICLE V
Host Club (s)

Section 1. GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Secure facilities adequately sized to accommodate Federation need for the meeting / dance or Festival / meeting dance to be hosted.
2. Provide details of costs, restrictions, insurance requirements, etc. when presenting their bid to the Board of Directors of the Federation.
3. Originate advertisements for the Square Chute and other media to promote the dance or Festival.
4. Federation Callers/Cuers. Insure that all Federation Callers/Cuers who give their time in support of the May Festival are fairly and equitably included in the dance program. Do not charge Federation Callers/Cuers any admission fees (donations) to the May Festival or any dance.
5. Collect all fees and provide complete income expense record to Federation Treasurer as soon following the activity as possible.

Section 2. WORKING FUND. Host club (s) will be provided adequate working funds from the Federation Treasurer to prevent a financial strain on their club (s) treasury.

Section 3. FACILITY INSURANCE. The Federation will secure necessary insurance coverage for the hosted activities.

Section 4. COMPENSATION. Host club (s) will be compensated for their service to the Federation as follows:

1. May Festival. Twenty percent of net proceeds or \$500.00, which ever is greater.
2. October and January Meeting and Dance. Twenty percent of net activity proceeds or \$125.00, which ever is greater.

Section 5. BOOTH SALES. Host club (s) as space allows, may permit shops selling square and round dance related items to set up booths at the May Festival or other Federation dances. The host club (s) is responsible to fairly determine who is to be included within the space available. The price per booth shall be no more than \$25 nor less than \$15.00 per 100 square feet of space provided. The host club (s) is also responsible to determine if the owners/administrators of the facility in which the dance is to occur will permit such selling.

ARTICLE VI Square Chute

Section 1. The Federation will provide the publication Square Chute quarterly as specified in the Bylaws, Article VIII.

Section 2. All member clubs may have their dance schedules published in the Square Chute provided that such schedules are submitted to the Editor on or before February 1, May 1, August 1, and November 1 for the following quarter.

Section 3. A list of the club Caller / Cuer for each Federation Club, including address and telephone number, will be published in the fourth quarter Square Chute provided that the clubs provide the information to the Editor by August 1.

Section 4. Other matters of interest to member clubs including pertinent excerpts from the minutes of the Federation meeting will be published as appropriate.

Section 5. ADVERTISING.

1. Advertising space is available to any club, shop or other enterprise provided same is beneficial to our square and round dance activity.
2. The current price for a Square Chute ad shall be \$10.00 per vertical inch of page space subject to change at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. EDITOR COMPENSATION. The Square Chute Editor shall be compensated \$200.00 per edition, said compensation adjusted from time to time at stated meetings by the Board of Directors

ARTICLE VII Member Club Insurance

Member clubs of the Illinois Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs will be enrolled in the State Council of Illinois Square Dance Associations "Blanket" insurance program at the Federation expense provided that

- a. The Federation treasury is able to continue to sustain the expense.
- b. The club is or becomes a member in good standing at the Annual (May) meeting.
- c. The club responds by established deadlines to any certifications that may be needed by the Federation.

ARTICLE VIII Standing Rule Amendments

These Standing Rules may be amended at any stated or called meeting of the Board of Directors at which a quorum is present.

ATTACHMENT

Illinois Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs Standing Rules

SUGGESTED MAY FESTIVAL PROCEDURE

Section 1. The purpose of the attachment is to provide guideline for the host club (s) to use in the planning and running of the Annual Square and Round Dance Festival.

Section 2. CHAIR.

1. General Chair. The Festival Committee Chair working with the host club (s) appoints a General Chair for the Festival. The General Chair appoints committees from the host club (s) as required and coordinates the entire Festival.
2. Assistant Chair may be appointed by the General Chair as needed.

Section 3. SUGGESTED FESTIVAL COMMITTEES. The following committees are suggested as those that are necessary to conduct the Festival. Host Club (s) may add or delete as appropriate.

1. Hospitality Committee. Contacts hotels, restaurants, and camping areas for prices and availability. Furnishes such information to Publicity Committee along with location and hours of church services. Helps prepare a simple city map showing location and directions of these and furnishes to Publicity Committee. Does everything possible for convenience of dancers, i.e. coat racks, ashtrays, etc.
2. Program Committee. Prepares program listing activities, etc., and is responsible for program printing. (Advertisement space in the printed program can be sold and will usually offset the cost of the program printing.) Secures caller and instructor scheduling from the Square Dance Committee and Round Dance Committee for inclusion in the program.
3. Publicity Committee. Publicity in the Square Chute, fliers, posters, local newspapers, etc. Include in publicity, especially in Square Chute, a simple map of Festival locations, etc.
4. Ticket and Registration Committee. Responsible for ticket sales (donation), coverage and registration at door. If badges are not used, prepare identifying ribbon, etc. to identify dancers who have paid admission.
5. Secretary-Treasurer. Prepares for Chair any necessary correspondence. Deposits advances from the Federation in an account separate from the host club's finances. Any bills paid from proceeds of Festival should be paid by check and an itemized receipt kept. Accumulates bills and receipts from all committees. Arranges for overnight safekeeping of the Festival receipts until they can be deposited or arrange night depository.

Settles all accounts as soon as possible after the Festival. Furnishes a complete financial report to the Federation Treasurer as soon as possible after the Festival.

6. Concessions. Snack bar optional, but soft drinks should be available for sale to dancers. Host club (s) may permit a church or other non-profit organization to provide these services if they prefer.
7. Square Dance Committee. Contacts all Federation Callers early in the spring to determine how many will be attending and dance levels performed. Fairly and equitably schedules Callers into the various time slots in the dance hall (s). Provides schedule to Program Committee for inclusion in the program. Serves as host to all callers including the Featured Caller.
8. Round Dance Committee. Send questionnaires to all member clubs requesting recommendations for rounds to be included in the dance program. Contacts the Featured Round Dance Cuer to determine the dance that will be taught. Contacts all Federation cuers early in the spring to determine who will be attending. Fairly and equitably schedules Federation cuers into the various time slots in the dance hall (s). Provides all this information to Program Committee for inclusion in the program. Serves as host to all cuers including the Featured Cuer.
9. Sound. Secure and check thoroughly prior to Festival the sound equipment for both square and round dance rooms. It is suggested that back-up equipment be available in case of emergency. (The Festival Featured Callers may bring their own equipment if preferred.)
10. Decoration. Optional, but experience has shown that moderate amounts of decorations enhance the enjoyment of the Festival.
11. Facility Committee. Arranges for all activities relating to the set-up and care of the physical facilities. Cleans the facilities before and after the dance sessions unless this service is provided as a part of the rental fee.
12. Master of Ceremonies. Keeps program moving and makes announcements.

Section 4. GENERAL.

1. All committees are to be instructed by the Chair that they must turn in receipts for all expenditures to receive reimbursements from the Federation.
2. Chair is responsible for helping the Festival Treasurer to furnish to the Federation Treasurer a complete financial report as soon as possible after the Festival.
3. The Officers of the Federation will help the host club (s) in any way needed.

Section 5. FEDERATION PRESIDENT. The Federation President is responsible to:

1. Secure insurance coverage for the May Festival including liability, theft of property, and vandalism of equipment.
2. Work closely with host club (s) in any way that they may need help or advice.

Section 6. BOOTH SALES. Guidelines for including booths for the sale of Square and Round dance related items are included under Standing Rules, Article V, Section 5.

Section 7. Facilities for May Festival Dance and Meeting. Any club volunteering to host the May Festival should plan for accommodations for 50 to 75 squares. In addition, plans should be made for adequate facilities for:

1. Housing: Motel and Hotel accommodations.
2. Eating accommodations
3. Parking.
4. Dance Area. Sufficient space for at least 50 to 75 squares.

Determine if the location will be available for rent on the dates needed. Secure firm rental price quotations.
